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Native Children Always Ride Safe



Risk it, get a ticket. It's your money and a child's life.

States and tribes have laws to keep children safe. Keep all children in a child safety seat, and keep your money in your wallet.

- Keep infants less than 1 year and less than 20 lbs. in a rear facing car seat.
- Keep children at least 1 year and 20 lbs or more in a forward facing car seat until 4 years.
- Keep children 4-8 and under 4'9" in a booster seat.
- Keep children 12 and under always in the back seat.

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
